Select a Distinctive Rooftop

Choosing a unique or unusual rooftop helps verify your current location and detect any deviation from your intended path.



Identify a Prominent Landmark

A highly landmark such as a lake can assist in quickly understanding my location from a distance and assessing the intended direction.



Use of Linear Features

Major terrain axes, such as roads or ridgelines, function similarly to landmarks—they provide a clear visual path to follow towards the target.



Utilizing Dense Vegetation or Tree Clusters

In open terrain, a distinctive group of bushes or trees can stand out and serve as a reliable reference point for orientation.



Focus on Visually Dominant Agricultural Fields

Features such as ground terraces or agricultural fields are visually prominent and can serve as effective orientation aids.



Cases of Complete NLOS

When there is total non-line-of-sight, locate a tall structure on the final ridge line to re-establish spatial awareness and gain perspective on the terrain layout as the missile is in the air
